Things to Know

Junior Camp is open to 4-H'ers in grades 4-6 (grade just completed). Campers will meet and ride a bus to camp. Transportation is included in camp fee.

Every effort is made to insure the safety of the campers. Katie Martin, 4-H agent, adult and teen volunteer leaders, and permanent camp staff encourage all participants to experience new adventures and make new friends.

Facilities are regularly inspected and meet health department guidelines. The 4-H Center is accredited according to the strict guidelines of the **American Camp Association**. A first-aid station is located on the campgrounds and a healthcare professional is employed by the 4-H Center. Medications for allergies and other illnesses are kept in a safe location and monitored by adults. It is the parents' responsibility to notify 4-H agent of any medical conditions that may apply to their child.

Professional and summer staff receive training in first -aid, safety procedures and program areas. There are two volunteer leaders for every 16 children, in addition to agents and camp staff. Three lifeguards and six adults are on duty at the pool at all times.

The Clyde York 4-H Center is located near Crossville atop the scenic Cumberland Plateau on 194 acres. The Center features an air-conditioned recreation hall and dining hall, and home-cooked meals where campers may return for seconds.

Eight air-conditioned cabins with modern bath facilities provide a wonderful atmosphere for campers. Accommodations for campers with disabilities are also available.

Grounds are fenced and gated for security purposes.
