How to Sign Up:

Camp sign-up begins **Friday, April 1**. Applications and payment can be turned in at the Extension Office. Office hours are 7:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday - Friday. Applications will be taken *until May 16*. Camp is limited to 65 youth. Sign-up is on a first-come, first-served basis.

Cost:

This year, the cost of camp is **\$315**. A deposit of \$160 or the full amount of \$315 is required at the time of registration. **The full balance is due by May 16. NO EXCEPTIONS.** We must turn in names of all campers at that time. Smith County will be charged for each camper that is registered.

The only valid reasons for a refund are:

1. Illness (ONLY with doctor's statement)
2. Injury (ONLY with doctor's statement)
3. Death in the family

Partial scholarships will be available again this year. **Applications are due April 11.** Look for scholarship applications on our website: smith.tennessee.edu. Scholarship recipients will be notified at a later date.

Things to Leave at Home

Junior Camp is open to 4-H'ers in grades 4-6 (as of January 1st of the current year). Campers will meet and ride a bus to camp. Transportation is included in the camp fee.

4-H Agent Katie Martin, adult and teen volunteer leaders, and permanent camp staff encourage all participants to experience new adventures and make new friends. Every effort is made to insure the safety of the campers.

Facilities are regularly inspected and meet health department guidelines. The 4-H Center is accredited according to the strict guidelines of the **American Camp Association**. A first-aid station is located on the campgrounds and a healthcare professional is employed by the 4-H Center. Medications for allergies and other illnesses are kept in a safe location and monitored by adults. It is the parents' responsibility to notify the 4-H agent of any medical conditions that may apply to their child.

Professional and summer staff receive training in first aid, safety procedures, and 4-H program areas. There are two volunteer leaders for every 16 children, in addition to agents and camp staff. Three lifeguards and six adults are on duty at the pool at all times.

The Clyde York 4-H Center is located near Crossville atop the scenic Cumberland Plateau on 194 acres. The 4-H Center features an air-conditioned recreation hall and dining hall, where campers are served home-cooked meals and may return for seconds.

Eight air-conditioned cabins with modern bath facilities provide a wonderful atmosphere for campers. Accommodations for campers with disabilities are also available.

Grounds are fenced and gated for security purposes.
