County winner receives \$50 and their teacher wins \$200 for use in their classroom!

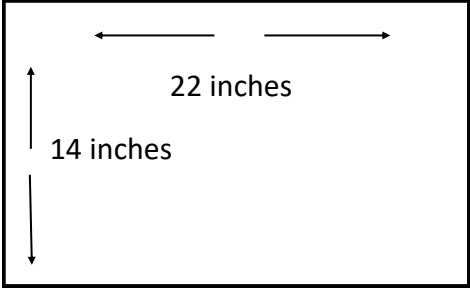
State Winners receive \$300 for 1st place, \$200 for 2nd, and \$100 for 3rd!

4-H Poster Contest | January 4-H Club Meeting

1. This year, 4-H members may submit either a traditional poster **or** a digital poster.
2. Posters **must be horizontal** only.
3. Physical posters must be 14 x 22 inches. Digital posters must be submitted as a PDF file.
4. Examples of programs that could be used for designing your digital poster include but are not limited to: Microsoft PowerPoint, Microsoft Publisher, Adobe Illustrator, Adobe InDesign, Canva



5. On the back of your poster be sure to include:

Name	Age	Address
Grade	School	Teacher's Name
6. 4-H should be the topic/theme of the poster.
7. Well-known cartoon figures such as SpongeBob, Charlie Brown, etc. cannot be used because of copyrighting.
8. Three dimensional objects or materials which extend 1/8-inch or more above the poster may not be used.
9. If the 4-H Emblem is used on the poster, do not place text or other images over or on top of it.
10. No glitter may be used on posters. If your poster has glitter, it **cannot** go on to the county or state contest!

Scoring Guidelines

- **INFORMATION GIVEN AND IDEAS EXPRESSED.....50 points**
 1. Theme 25 points
 2. Simplicity 10 points
 3. Originality 15 points
- **ART, DESIGN, LETTERING.....40 points**
 1. Pleasing composition, attractive 10 points
 2. Dynamic, eye-catching, original 10 points
 3. Neat, easy-to-read lettering 10 points
 4. Use of color 10 points
- **CONSTRUCTION.....10 points**
 1. Materials: texture, shape, size 5 points
 2. Durable enough to withstand shipping 5 points



Winners

Three county winners will be entered in the state poster contest. The state competition will be held in March during 4-H Congress. All State level entries will be displayed during 4-H Congress.
